Dr. Swati Sahasrabudhe and Mr. Jaisurya Das suggested that SIU should map research performed at SIU with contemporary research topics including SDGs.	 1. QMB will organize two <i>Prakarsh</i> QMB sessions each quarter. The upcoming session, focusing on SDGs mapping, is currently scheduled for January 2024. 2. SIU has mapped its research output (in terms of Scopus/WoS publications) with contemporary research topics including SDGs for the period 2017-2021. The Scopus/ WoS publications data clearly shows that the faculty members/researchers of SIU are conducting research in the following "Top 11 niche areas". In each of these 11 areas, the number of publications is>50% of total SIU publications.

In response to instructions from the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC), SCCCS has submitted a revised proposal in collaboration with the Zoological Survey of India (ZSI), Kumaun University Nainital, and Uttarakhand Pollution Control Board. The proposal has been shortlisted for presentation and recommended for merging with G. B. Pant National Institute of Himalayan Environment (NIHE), Sikkim Regional Centre, Gangtok, Sikkim University, Sikkim, IIT-Kharagpur, NCSCM Chennai, NIHE Ladakh Regional Centre.
